RECYCLED WATER RESEARCH WORKSHOP

- State Water Board convened a 2-day workshop to develop recycled water CEC research priorities
 - Held at SCCWRP Oct 27-28
- ~ 50 participants
 - Wastewater treatment agencies
 - Stormwater managers
 - Water supply utilities
 - Regulators
- Organized in partnership with three research entities
 - Southern California Coastal Water Research Project Authority
 - National Water Research Institute
 - WateReuse Research Foundation

ORGANIZING THEMES

Monitoring/assessing CECs

- Targeted chemical analyses
- Cell bioassays
- Non-targeted chemical analyses

Treatment processes to remove CECs

- Source water control
- Optimizing use of current treatment technology
- Developing new treatment technologies
- Reliability and resilience

PRIORITY RESEARCH NEEDS FOR CEC MONITORING

- Relatively equal interest among targeted, nontargeted and bioassay approaches
 - Water utilities were more interested in improving targeted approaches
 - Regulators were more interested in developing bioassays
 - Non-targeted analysis was a runaway preference as the second priority by both groups
- Investigate source water and transformational products as water moves through the treatment train
 - Establish baseline and identify unexpected chemicals
- Assess impact on humans and aquatic wildlife
 - Need better interpretation tools for using all three lines of evidence

PRIORITY RESEARCH NEEDS FOR TREATMENT TECHNOLOGY

- Predominant feeling was that existing technology works well for most CECs
 - Greatest need is in ensuring that those technologies are properly deployed
 - Also to ensure a real time monitoring system that alerts operators to plant upset
- Develop standardized operator training programs
- Develop better surrogate measures for CEC removal
- Link development of new technologies to unexpected chemicals found in treatment train studies

NEXT STEPS

- Formalize the research prioritization process
 - State Board next week will be sending participants a survey of potential projects for which they can vote
 - Will use the survey to prioritize among topic areas and among projects
- State will release a workshop report in February
 - We are helping them write several sections of the report
- The workshop report will inform research directions for Prop 1 funds
