


Jack Colford, MD PhD



Dr. Jack Colford is a professor of epidemiology at the UC Berkeley School of Public Health. He trained at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine (MD degree), UC San Francisco (residency in internal medicine and fellowships in infectious diseases and HIV/AIDS), Stanford (Chief Medical Resident), and UC Berkeley (PhD degree). In the US, he has been the principal investigator for numerous studies of the relationship between water quality indicators and human health funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the Environmental Protection Agency, and the State of California. He has also been the principal investigator of randomized field trials and observational studies evaluating the impact of water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) interventions in India, Bolivia, Guatemala, Bangladesh, Kenya, Mexico, and the United States with funding from the NIH, the Gates Foundation, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. He is a principal investigator of the Gates Foundation-funded WASH Benefits Study. He teaches semester-long graduate courses each year at UC Berkeley on epidemiologic methods, intervention trial design, and impact evaluation for health professionals. He also teaches epidemiology each summer at the University of Zurich.
